
- This scholarship fund was created through donations of animals for resale through the Cowlitz County Market Sale program taking place at the Cowlitz County Fair annually.



Amounts of awards may vary and priority may be given to those that exhibit financial need and/or hardship.

Guidelines:

- Enrolled as a Cowlitz County 4-H and/or FFA member for the current year.
- Scholarship Selection
 Committee will evaluate and approve recipients as merited.
- 3. Scholarship amount will be payable to the recipient.
- 4. No checks will be issued prior to March 1, 2024.
- If total amount of scholarship is not used, remainder must be returned to the Cowlitz County Market Sale Committee.





Applicant Instructions:

- 1. Scholarship Application for 2020 (included).
- 2. There will be an in-person interview process for the finalists in this scholarship process. You will present your project and proposed care plan during this interview.
- 3. A letter of recommendation in a sealed envelope from a 4-H Leader (Non-Parent), FFA Advisor, or other personal reference (May be the same person that signs off on your endorsement section of the application).

The letter should include how long they have been a leader/advisor, how long they have known the applicant, in what project areas the applicant has previously done work in and how well that work was followed through on, if the applicant has mentored any other youth in a similar project (showing leadership skills). Please include any additional information you wish to add.

Note: Recommendations received from parent or guardian not accepted.

- 4. Attach up to two pages on a separate sheet of paper that outlines your plans for care, management, feeding, and health of this animal (listed on Application as well). Please use an easy to read, 12 point font, for all additional documents/attachments.
- 5. Follow-up Letter (after the sale and fair) This will focus on what you have accomplished during the past project year through working with and raising your market project animal, if your goals were met, and any successes or challenges that you had during this process.
 Follow-up letters shall be mailed to the Market Sale P.O. Box, by September 1, 2024. Failure to do this may disqualify you from being eligible for this scholarship in the future.
